San Jose State remains a constant threat to pull off an upset victory on any given night, led primarily by the scoring of Adrian Oliver.

Oliver is the WAC's leading scorer so far this season and it isn't even close. The next closest player is currently averaging 8.2 fewer points per game than Oliver. He also is shooting 44.9 percent from the field this season, which is not too shabby at all for somebody who takes as many shots as Oliver does.

Joining Oliver in the backcourt is fellow senior Justin Graham, who is chipping in 15 points per game and has finally cut down on his turnovers this season.

Down low is big man Wil Carter, who is averaging 8.4 points and 8.2 rebounds per game this season. Carter has also averaged nearly four fouls per game this season, which could be very bad news for him if he is stuck guarding Tai Wesley.

As a team, the Spartans are shooting a WAC-worst 39.5 percent from the field. The Aggies on the other hand are tops in the WAC in that department, shooting 46.1 percent.

Still, containing Oliver will be the key for Utah State, much like how containing Wesley will be the biggest point of emphasis for San Jose. The thing the Aggies have in their favor is that Pooh Williams might be the best defensive player in the conference, and has handled Oliver before.
